Developing individual techniques

- 6. Do not use the dictionary constantly (Try to guess the meaning of new words and remember that if the number of new words is so high that you have to refer to the dictionary repeatedly, that text is not suitable for your language level and can Must be discarded)

Last but not least, the books we read outside our specialty can have an unpredictable effect on our performance in that area. Much of what we learn is unconsciously learned and helps us build a consistent network of books we read and continually change these networks with new books we read that have a profound impact on type and quality. It will connect us with humans and the world around us. Nowadays, with the advent of technology, access to resources has become much easier, with virtual books, social networks and different applications making it possible for individuals to study at any time and place at no cost.

4. The ability to read and inspire short stories to enhance it

The more we read, the better our minds learn how English works. It is as if English is slowly coming into our minds and we can think of English. So for these reasons, we need to read many books to learn English.

Choosing the right book for learning English

Probably the first question that comes to anyone's mind at this stage is what book to read?

We can't find a fixed answer to this question. In fact, in order to choose the right book for everyone, we need to consider a number of personal factors:

- 1. We need to understand at least about 4-5% of the words and sentences of the book, otherwise we cannot understand the whole story and meaning of the book.
- We should be interested in the subject of that book. In other words, if we have a Persian version of that book, read it with interest.
- We need to find the audio version too. In the following lesson, this is explained.

4. It is recommended that we start with a book that we have a brief introduction to. For example, we've read the Farsi translation before, or seen the movie. Reading the summary of that book is also a good way to get to know it. The point is that if you are familiar with that book, it will be easier to understand the sentences and their meaning in the absence of some words and sentences; We notice it and are less likely to be tired or discouraged.

How to read a book to learn English Our approach to reading a book at this point is as follows: Open the book - paper or digital.

- 1. We play the audio book.
- 2. As we listen to the audio book, we follow and read the sentences we hear with our own eyes.

In any case, whether we understand the words or the sentences or not, we speed up the book with the speed of the audio book. Here we love the subject of the book and are involved in an interesting story. We also pass through them, even though we may not understand some of the words and sentences. Otherwise, we will stop at the very first pages of the book. In fact, an essential skill at this point is to be able to jump from words we don't understand and at the same time make good guesses about the general meaning. This is what we do in childhood and adolescence.

Enhance the hearing of pronunciation of sentences

Boost reading, the first step

The first thing to do to boost your reading is to produce a good number of stories, texts and newspapers or anything that can be read.

Tip: Avoid picking very difficult texts as it will bother you.

If your language level is beginner, if you are a Starter-Elementary learner, the best source for reading is the same language textbooks you work for. The other best source is the simplified storybook.

How to Enhance Reading? Instructions

Once we have selected our text, we will proceed with the following steps.

Tip: Keep in mind that when it comes to enhancing reading, it's not only meaningful in itself, but other speaking and writing skills are also unintentionally involved and reinforced, in addition to Vocabulary Spelling Words and Grammar. At the same time it is affected.

So when we talk about reading reinforcement, we unintentionally embrace all aspects of language.

- . Take a look at the photos and headlines and read them.
- 2. We try to either write or say what we hear from headlines and photos, but we must speak or write English.
- 3. Once we read the text quickly, try not to go too deep into the text, just to get a general idea of the text.
- 4. Speak or write about what you received again.
- Read the text carefully this time and highlight words you don't know and try to guess words you don't know during this time. This time you have to be very careful in reading the text.
- 6. Talk or write in detail about what you read.
- 7. Look for words you don't know what they mean.
- Choose your favorite dictionary. My recommendation is Cambridge Online Dictionary.
- Read the meaning of the word
- Carefully review its examples.
- Hear the correct pronunciation along with word stress.
- Repeat the word repeatedly with the correct pronunciation.
- Write word over and over again. Just like when we were writing homework.
- Write the word in its vocabulary, along with its meaning and even its synonyms and antonyms.
- Make sentences with the word.
- Review words every few days
- Write text or talk about a topic as the number of words increases and use those words.
- Go to the text again Try this time to find the grammar of sentences that you find interesting or doubtful or don't understand.
- 9. Learn and review grammar.
- Read the text smoothly again so you can hear your voice. If you have difficulty in spelling a word, be sure to check the dictionary.
- 11. Make a summary of the text where you have used all the structures and words you have learned.

Conclusion

The study has significant implications firstly, literature can be used as a positive stimulation to motivate students, and short stories are ideal literary means for classroom usage. Secondly, rather than focusing on more mechanical aspects of the language the students absorb in the short story with a high motivation level. By studying literature, students learn about the past and present about people's customs and traditions via stories together with learning about the culture.

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
